

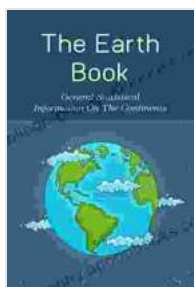

Land Area

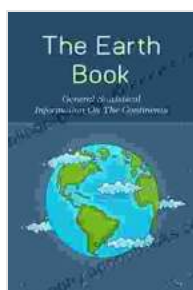
